Kenya Cultural Centre Incorporating the Kenya National Theatre in partnership with the Kenya International Theatre Festival Trust will be running a theatre capacity building & competition program dubbed County Theatre Fiesta (CTF) for Fifteen_select counties in six training centres.

Objectives of the program:

- Train and nurture theatre talents at the county level
- Promote Theatre awareness within counties
- Encourage a theatre-going culture in Kenyan counties
- Select theatre groups from the counties to perform at the Kenya International Theatre Festival (KITFest2025)

The program will train theatre companies with a maximum of 10 individuals per group, by holding a 10 days virtual training and 10-days physical training in select training centers before the Gala Edition, at the Kenya National Theatre during KITFest2025. One outstanding theatre group from each county will be facilitated to represent their county at KITFest2025.

The theme of this year's CTF is "A Decade Of Connecting Cultures", which emphasizes the role of theatre in raising awareness about social issues and the need for collective action to address them. The Program will commence in April and end in November. For this years' program only theatre companies/groups from the following counties are eligible to register; Mombasa, Kiambu, Embu, Nakuru, Kisumu, Uasin Gishu, Siaya, Migori, Nyeri, Lamu, Kakamega, Kwale, Machakos, Narok and Trans Nzoia.




BAND WEDNESDAY

Kenya Cultural Centre and Kenya International Theatre Festival Trust Launch County Theatre Fiesta 2025



In a significant stride towards nurturing theatre talent across Kenya, the Kenya Cultural Centre incorporating the Kenya National Theatre, in partnership with the Kenya International Theatre Festival (KITFest) Trust, has launched the County Theatre Fiesta (CTF) program. This theatre capacity-building and competition initiative will engage fifteen selected counties, strategically grouped into six training centers.

The County Theatre Fiesta aims to train and nurture theatre talent at the county level, promote awareness and appreciation of theatre, and encourage a theatre-going culture. Additionally, it will identify outstanding theatre groups from participating counties to perform at the Kenya International Theatre Festival (KITFest 2025). Themed "A Decade of Connecting Cultures," this year's County Theatre Fiesta underscores the vital role of theatre in addressing social issues and fostering collective action for meaningful change.



To ensure the successful execution of the program, KCC and KITFest Trust recently conducted a workshop focused on selecting trainers and developing a comprehensive training module. The workshop brought together program staff and consultants to create a well-rounded training curriculum that will equip thespians with essential skills in acting, directing, marketing, producing, stage management, lighting & sound design, entertainment law, wellness, and scriptwriting.





Following this, the selected trainers participated in the Training of Trainers workshop, which equipped them with the necessary skills to develop content for various courses and create assessment criteria. This retreat aligned trainers with the County Theatre Fiesta's vision, guided them in structuring comprehensive content for nine identified courses, and equipped them with effective content delivery techniques. Trainers also developed standardized assessment criteria to evaluate artist performance and fostered collaboration to strengthen the program's impact.



With the groundwork now laid, the County Theatre Fiesta is set to commence, bringing theatre closer communities and offering aspiring thespians platform to hone their craft. The program not only seeks to elevate theatre at the county level but also to provide a gateway for the best performers to showcase their talents at KITFest 2025, further cementing Kenya's position as a hub for vibrant theatre arts.

As the program unfolds, the Kenya Cultural Centre and KITFest Trust remain committed to promoting a thriving theatre industry that connects cultures, empowers artists, and transforms communities through performing arts.



Kenya Cultural Centre Advances Certification Efforts for Poetry Theatre Trainees Through RPL Training



The Kenya Cultural Centre incorporating Kenya National Theatre (KCC-NT) continues to make significant strides in promoting and developing the cultural and creative industry. As part of its commitment to nurturing talent in the performing arts, KCC-NT successfully implemented the Poetry Theatre Artistes Training under the Poetry Theatre Development (PTD) Project. This initiative, funded by Ignite Culture: ACP-EU Culture Programme (Eastern Africa), was designed to address the knowledge, skills, and professional development needs of both aspiring and practicing poets.







To facilitate the assessment of Poetry Theatre Artistes Training graduates, KCC-NT staff members and Poetry Theatre Development trainers participated in an intensive RPL training program. The training, conducted by TVET-CDACC in collaboration with the Kenya School of TVET, took place from March 10th to 14th, 2025, at Kabete National Polytechnic. The program covered essential aspects, including understanding the RPL framework, awareness creation, counselling and facilitation, assessment and certification processes, monitoring and evaluation, and final assessment of the participants. Through these components, participants gained critical knowledge and skills to conduct assessments effectively and guide trainees through the certification process.



The successful completion of the RPL training marks a significant milestone in KCC-NT's mission to professionalize the poetry theatre sector. Equipped with the necessary expertise, the Centre's trainers are now well-positioned to facilitate the certification of Poetry Theatre trainees, ensuring their talents and efforts are formally recognized. This development reinforces KCC-NT's commitment to fostering excellence in Kenya's creative and cultural landscape.



Kenya Cultural Centre Participates in Performing Arts Week & World Theatre Day Celebrations
