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
BAND WEDNESDAY


PAL LIVE


County Theatre Fiesta 2025 Concludes with Final Nine-Day Intensive Program in Mombasa



The County Theatre Fiesta (CTF) Mombasa and Lamu Edition concluded on September 28, 2025, marking the successful finale of the CTF 2025 program. After traveling through five training centres across the country, this final edition brought together trainees, trainers, and staff at the Little Theatre Club in Mombasa for a nine-day intensive program. The theatre training and performance program, which ran from September 20 to 28, was coordinated by the Kenya Cultural Centre in partnership with the Kenya International Theatre Festival (KITFEST).

The program opened with a ceremony led by Mr. Benson Ngobia, Director of KITFEST, who outlined the comprehensive training structure that would guide participants through various aspects of professional theatre production. The Fiesta covered essential areas including entertainment law, wellness, production design, acting, directing, stage management, marketing, sound and lighting, producing and audio play production. A notable presence throughout the nine-day program was Ms. Lorna Lemi, the KITFest@10 ambassador, who actively engaged with participants and supported the training initiative.






Five production groups participated in the program, representing both Mombasa and Lamu counties. The Mombasa-based groups included Creative Art 254, Talent Bosses Agency, Creative Nexus Theatre Group, and Little Theatre Club, while Lamu county was represented by Lamu Arts and Theatre Alliance.

The program focused on skill acquisition and team-building through structured classes covering the different training areas. Joint sessions focused on wellness and life skills as well as production crew classes that ensured all participants gained basic technical knowledge regardless of their chosen specialization.

The Fiesta demonstrated environmental responsibility through a tree planting exercise conducted at the Little Theatre Club on September 24, 2025, reinforcing the arts community's commitment to sustainability and environmental stewardship.

The final phase featured technical rehearsals and performances from September 26 to 28, with trainers providing structured feedback after each rehearsal. The performances included a competitive element where Lamu Arts and Theatre Alliance took first place and Creative Art 254 secured second position. Both winning groups have qualified to participate in KITFEST 2025, providing them with a platform to showcase their talents on a national stage.





A highlight of the Fiesta was the Sauti za Boma audioplay program, which brought together trainees with a trainer and sound engineer. After participating in common sessions on entertainment law and mental health, this specialized group focused on audioplay scripting, performance, and technical production. The participants worked in a professional recording studio to produce original audioplays, gaining valuable hands-on experience in audio storytelling.

The closing ceremony underscored the program's significance in Kenya's cultural landscape, celebrating the achievements of the coastal region's emerging theatre artists and bringing the CTF 2025 countrywide tour to a triumphant close.

Through its comprehensive approach combining technical training, legal education, wellness components, and community engagement, the County Theatre Fiesta Mombasa and Lamu Edition successfully concluded the 2025 program, having established a strong foundation for the continued growth of theatre arts across all five regions visited while contributing to Kenya's broader creative economy development goals.



Kenya Cultural Centre Strengthens Global Theatre Partnerships at Guangzhou International Performing Arts Fair



The Kenya Cultural Centre (KCC) made significant strides in positioning Kenya on the global performing arts map through its participation in the 16th China (Guangzhou) International Performing Arts Fair and the 3rd Investment and Trade Fair of the Silk Road International League of Theatres (SRILT), held from September 25-28, 2025.

The prestigious event, which took place at the Guangzhou Opera House, brought together leading performing arts institutions from around the world, with KCC standing out as one of only three African members of SRILT represented at the fair.

Leading the Kenyan delegation, KCC Chief Executive Officer Michael Pundo, together with Manager of Programs and Business Development Kevin Kahuro, delivered a strategic presentation to international performing arts organizations. The pitch focused on forging partnerships that will open new markets, establish touring circuits, and create capacity-building opportunities for Kenyan theatre groups and companies within the expansive Silk Road network.

In addition to the formal presentations, KCC set up an exhibition space at the fair, offering participants comprehensive information about the Centre's programming, available partnership frameworks, and an overview of Kenya's vibrant and growing creative industry landscape.







The Kenya Cultural Centre's participation in this high-profile international event underscores the country's commitment to cultural diplomacy and the development of its performing arts sector. Through such strategic engagements, KCC continues to create pathways for Kenyan artists and theatre practitioners to showcase their talent on international stages while fostering meaningful cultural exchanges.

The Silk Road International League of Theatres serves as a crucial platform for cultural cooperation among member institutions across continents, facilitating artistic exchanges, co-productions, and professional development opportunities in the performing arts sector.



Kenya Cultural Centre Validates Poetry Theatre Artistes Through RPL Assessment



The Kenya Cultural Centre concluded a landmark Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) assessment for Poetry Theatre Artistes on September 23, 2025, marking a significant milestone in the formal validation of creative sector skills through Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET) qualifications.

The two-day assessment, which commenced on September 22, evaluated candidates across multiple critical competencies including poetry theatre producing, marketing, publishing, performance, writing, entertainment law, workplace essential skills and digital literacy skills. The initiative was guided by the TVET Curriculum Development, Assessment and Certification Council (TVET CDACC).

The assessed artistes are participants of the Poetry Theatre Development Project, a program that brought together poets from ten counties across Kenya: Nairobi, Narok, Nakuru, Kisumu, Kakamega, Busia, Embu, Mombasa, Kilifi, and Turkana.

The RPL framework allows experienced practitioners in the creative industry to have their existing knowledge and skills formally recognized through industry-standard qualifications, eliminating the need to undergo full training programs for competencies they have already mastered through practice.







The initiative represents a growing recognition of the creative sector's professionalization needs and bridges the gap between practical artistic experience and formal certification, potentially opening new opportunities for poetry theatre practitioners in terms of employment, funding access, and professional development.

The Poetry Theatre Development Project and subsequent RPL assessment underscore Kenya's efforts to strengthen its cultural and creative industries through structured training and recognized credentialing systems that align with national TVET standards.
